From the Pastor

A new church year is upon us! It's full of opportunities and possibilities; it will bring surprises, disappointments and unforeseen journeys. We need, we profoundly need, for each of you to play a part in the year to come.

One of our big challenges this year will be adjusting to a new “mix” of young people who worship with us. We have an influx of children graduating from the nursery into Discovery Zone and worship. We think the best answer is to split Discovery Zone by age and separate the kids into two groups. We don't presently have the volunteers to support what we believe is the very best way to nurture our young people. You may not “see” yourself as a teacher, but every group needs two adults, only one of which is the teacher or facilitator. The other adults supports and helps and works with kids. Even if you're not a “teacher”, I know many of you have the “gift” of helping and this would be a great place to express that gift.

Last year we started keeping all but our nursery kids in the sanctuary for worship. We have a back table where the kids have some worship related projects (simple crafts, coloring pages, etc.) to keep them busy while they listen in the background to the sermon. Last year, a single adult volunteered to be with the kids at the table during worship. This year, we anticipate an explosion of kids at that table and we really need two adults per week with the kids. You give up one Sunday a month where you can't just concentrate on yourself and your life in worship, but on the other hand you have the opportunity to help our youngest members experience worship in an age appropriate way. Again, this isn't “teaching”, the material is prepared by the Nurture Team. It is

simply being “with” the young people at the table during worship and helping them to understand what it means to be in a worship service.

Sometimes in church we use the word “calling” to describe the path a given community takes. If Southminster’s calling is to help develop young people into mature followers of Jesus (something virtually assumed in our current Mission Statement and our baptismal vows), then we believe that part of that “calling” is the tools (people, space, finances) needed to live out the calling. We’re asking you (each and every one of you, yes, including YOU) to be part of our calling to nurture and mature our young people into followers of Jesus. If you would like to explore how YOU can help in Discovery Zone or with kids in worship, please talk with Wendy Woodley or me.

Let the new year begin!

Happy Labor Day! Well, it's that time of year again, summer is over and it's time to get back to Sunday school.

The Nurture team is recruiting more volunteers for the fall programming. One area that needs additional help is the back table during worship. There will be at least six children under six every week. For these children under second grade, we're asking

for two people to team up and supervise them at the table. Learning materials are provided each week. If we have enough volunteers you may possibly only have to do this once every four to six weeks. Another opportunity available is during the 10am Discovery Zone program. Do you enjoy teaching, games, crafts, cooking, science, drama or music? We would love you to join us in the experience, the materials are also provided several weeks in advance. Show us your talents! We are happy to work around your schedule. This is not a commitment for the entire year, just one rotation series at a time. A sign up for additional nursery workers will also be available. Do you need a hug, or a cherubic smile? This is where you can find them!

Discovery Zone resumes on September 9th at 10am. The studies of the September rotation will be about Jesus calling the Disciples. This is a family oriented time, children and adults learn the same biblical context every week. Give it a try, you'll be pleasantly surprised. The October and November lessons are on Jesus and Nicodemus.

Still on the Journey through the Bible in a year? The daily self-study reading plan continues through the remainder of 2018. Every Sunday, the weekly reading plan is printed in the bulletin. Have you fallen behind? Not to worry, just start picking up your bible again and read the weekly passages. Even if you missed a few books, you've still accomplished something great.

Sunday evening youth group meetings for middle and high school will resume in September. A schedule of events, is not complete at this time.

On either the Sunday afternoon of September 16th or 23rd all youth will meet at the church for a Polaroid party. This event will kick off the new school year. The young people had a great time

going on this picture scavenger hunt last year and have requested another. All ages of youth are welcome!

The 2018 Vacation Bible School program held this year was in partnership with our neighbor St. Constance. They hosted the event at their church. Over forty children attended VBS every evening! The children had a great time learning that Jesus forgives, gives them hope and, loves them.

Thanks to all of the volunteers that helped with the program and joined us in this ecumenical VBS experience. A special thanks to Pastor Clint for taking pictures, Alex for teaching the children sign language for all of the songs they learned, Giovanna for leading the kids in an Echo Pantomime, Mr. Tony for taking on games, Connie and her demonstrative reading on the story of Lazarus, Kay for doing snack detail, Marnie for registration, Nancy, Mary, Pat, Bethany and Owen for craft and supervision. This was a great team of volunteers!

St. Constance wrote a very nice thank you and it is posted on the Nurture board in fellowship hall. They were very grateful and appreciative of our participation with VBS and were very happy to have partnered with us in this fun filled week. It was a great experience!

The July Youth Mission Trip was another wonderful experience for our youth. The kids and their advisors worked very hard during this mission experience. They represented Southminster exceptionally, and we are so very proud of them and to have supported them on their journey.

Women's Circles

Our circles will resume this month. We will have an All Circle Meeting on Thursday, September 6 at 7:00 p.m.

Our study book is the “Cloud of Witnesses”, which is a study of the Letter to the Hebrews which is a significant book of the Bible, and is also significantly different from every other book in the Bible.

It consists of thirteen chapters, all of which are packed with theology, metaphor, comparisons, and spirituality. We will explore nine major themes, relate those themes to other parts of our faith tradition, and tie them together with the overarching motif of community. The community for which the letter was written interacts, in a sense, with all the communities of which we are a part, because we bring those groups with us wherever we go—they have helped to form us into the people we are. The community in which we study and worship, our family and friends, social and therapy groups . . . all are part of us. Our prayer is that the study of community in Hebrews will help us strengthen our own communities.

We will again be participating in the Presbyterian Women's Ingathering. More about this at your meetings.
